ELDERFLOWER AND ROSE PETAL TONER

Infusing elderflowers and rose petals in witch hazel magnifies their skin-toning gifts, making this a wonderful facial treatment. It also makes a soothing spray for sunburns. For both applications, it's handy to store this in a small spray bottle.

Yield: 2 cups

½ cup dried elderflowers

1 cup dried rose petals

Up to 2 cups witch hazel distillate

- Place the elderflowers and rose petals in a pint jar. Pour in enough witch hazel distillate to fill the jar and submerge the flowers completely. (You might not use the entire 2 cups.)
- Stir to release any air bubbles. Tightly cover the jar and label it.
- Store the jar in a cool, dark place for 4 weeks. Shake the jar daily for the first week, and make sure the plant material stays submerged under the witch hazel for the remainder of the macerating time.
- Strain the mixture through cheesecloth, squeezing it well to extract all the liquid.
- Use a funnel to pour the toner into small, clean spray bottles. Store in a cool, dark place. Use within 1 year.
